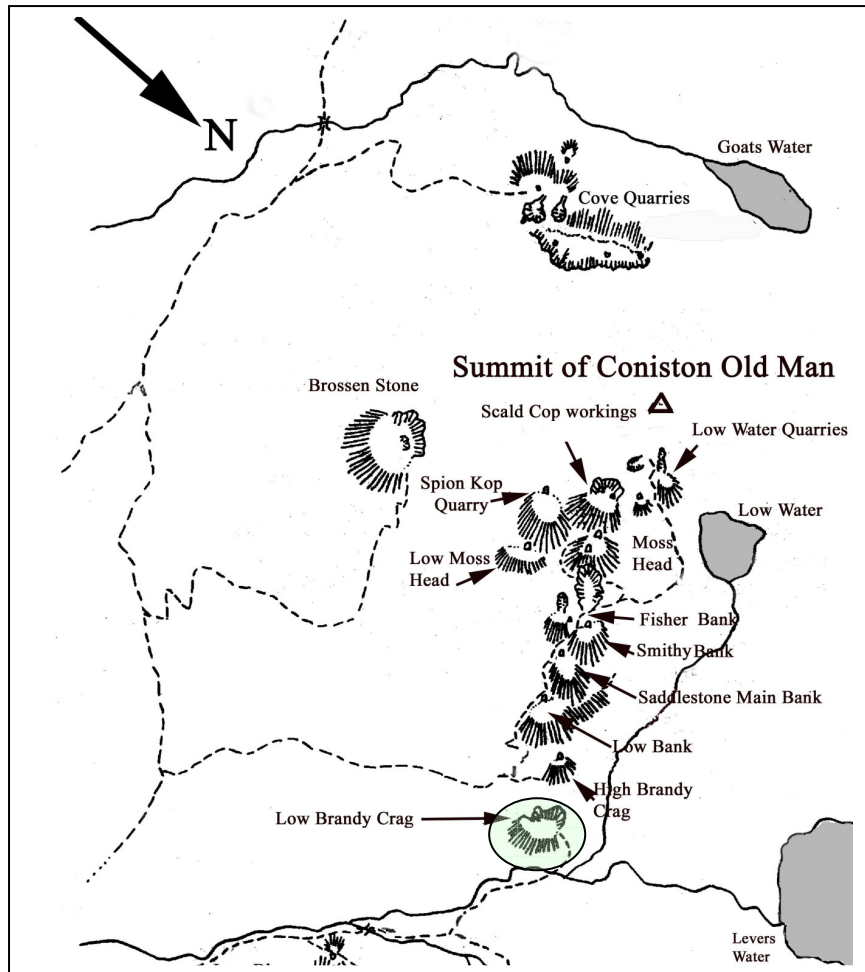


CONISTON OLD MAN HISTORICAL AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL SURVEY

Low Brandy Crag

This was formerly another small 19th C slate mine site worked with limited success. However in 1982, twenty three years after the Old Man Quarry complex closed, Burlington Slate re-opened Low Brandy Crag to allow them to obtain, once more, silver-grey slate rock. Low Brandy Crag has worked more or less continuously since then. Slate clogs are removed by four wheel drive heavy trucks and taken down to Burlington's main processing site at Kirkby in Furness, outside the confines of the National Park.
